# Ambassador Activities

Below is a list of suggested activities for GLRC Ambassadors. These ideas can support your outreach efforts. Be sure to document and submit your actions through your Ambassador account. You're also welcome to explore additional initiatives beyond this list.

## Promote GLRC on Social Media

Help spread awareness by sharing official GLRC posts and information across platforms such as Facebook and Instagram. Tag the official pages to help increase visibility.

## Add Your GLRC Ambassador Role to Profiles

Display your GLRC role proudly on your social and professional platforms like LinkedIn or Facebook. You can include a link to your ambassador profile.

## Share GLRC with Friends and Classmates

Talk to peers in your school, university, or community about GLRC, explaining what the competition is and why it's exciting. Encourage them to participate.

## Talk to Teachers and Coordinators

Introduce GLRC to teachers, club mentors, and school officials. Provide information about the educator platform and special awards for schools.

## Present GLRC in Classes or Clubs

Give a brief presentation about the competition during a class session or club meeting to spark interest among students.

## Distribute Posters and Flyers

Print and hang official GLRC posters at school, community centers, or libraries to attract attention. Digital copies can be found on the GLRC website.

## Start a Reasoning Club or Group

Form a group at your school to explore reasoning problems together, host problem-solving sessions, or use GLRC problems to build engagement.

### **Organize Reasoning Workshops or Events**

Plan events like problem-solving workshops, project showcases, or Q&A sessions where you introduce GLRC and reasoning topics in an interactive way.

### **Create a Local Social Media Group**

Establish a local WhatsApp or Facebook group for your school or city to coordinate GLRC efforts and share updates.

### **Collaborate with Local Organizations**

Work with local clubs, academic hubs, or institutions to promote GLRC or co-host events that highlight the importance of logic and reasoning.

### **Share GLRC through Newsletters or Blogs**

Submit a short article about GLRC to your school's newsletter, student blog, or internal communication platforms.

### **Encourage Other Schools to Join**

Extend outreach to other schools or universities in your area. Offer to share materials or connect them with the GLRC organizing team.

### **Arrange Local Meetups**

Organize informal meetups for interested students to discuss reasoning topics and learn more about the competition together.

### **Support the Qualification Round at Your School**

Coordinate with teachers to hold a scheduled Qualification Round session and assist participants in preparing and submitting their solutions.

### **Represent GLRC at Local Events**

If your school or city hosts academic fairs, science fests, or STEM days, represent GLRC by setting up a booth or delivering a short talk.

### **Inspire Through Your Own Participation**

Lead by example: participate actively in GLRC and share your journey and insights with others to motivate them.
